John C. Wasmuth, W8BP Marquette MI



Three Companies Agree to Plead Guilty for Fixing Prices of Electrolytic Capacitors

The US Department of Justice announced this week that three companies have agreed to plead guilty for their roles in a conspiracy to fix prices for electrolytic capacitors sold to customers in the US and elsewhere. The companies are Rubycon Corporation, Elna Co Ltd, and Holy Stone Holdings Co Ltd.

"The Antitrust Division has now charged five companies and one individual for their participation in this international price-fixing conspiracy," Deputy Assistant Attorney General Brent Snyder of the Justice Department's Antitrust Division, said in an August 23 Justice Department **news release**. "The electrolytic capacitors conspiracy affected millions of American consumers who use electronic devices containing capacitors every day."

The division filed one-count felony charges against each of the three companies in US District Court in San Francisco. In addition to pleading guilty to the charges against them, each company has agreed to pay a criminal fine and to cooperate with the Division's ongoing investigation. The plea agreements are subject to court approval.

NEC TOKIN Corp and Hitachi Chemical Co Ltd already pleaded guilty earlier to participating in the same worldwide conspiracy. NEC TOKIN was sentenced to pay a \$13.8 million fine in January, while a \$3.8 million fine was levied on Hitachi Chemical in June. In March of 2015, a grand jury indicted Takuro Isawa, a former Global Sales general manager for one of the capacitor manufacturers, for his alleged participation in the conspiracy.

This week's charges resulted from an ongoing federal investigation by the Antitrust Division's San Francisco Office and the FBI's San Francisco Field Office into price fixing, bid rigging, and other anticompetitive conduct in the capacitor industry. Anyone with information on price fixing, bid rigging or other anticompetitive conduct related to the capacitors industry should contact the Antitrust Division's **Citizen Complaint Center**, tel (888) 647-3258, or or call the FBI tip line, (415) 553-7400. The Justice Department released court documents on **Elna**, **Holy Stone**, and **Rubycon**.

UNIQUE REPAIR EXPERIENCEBy Bill, N8NJA

My friend Tony, KC8NUR from Perkins was having problems with his antenna system. He just could not make any headway with it. So, I told him when I came up for the U.P. Hamfest (great swap by the way) I would bring some test equipment and take a look and see what we could figure out.

So Thursday I loaded up two antenna analyzers, a watt meter, dummy load, 949E MFJ antenna tuner, digital VOM meter, extra coax and a hf radio. As we were traveling across U.S. 2 (we, is me and my friend Jim W8OFC) I get a call from Tony. He had to make an unplanned trip to the Lower Peninsula. So no trouble shooting on the antenna system. I told him to bring his tuner and I would give him mine. We made arrangements to meet on U.S. 2. So we meant in Manistique said hi and I let him take my turner and he gave me his 949E.

Now the rest of the story. I got the tuner home and hooked it up to my full wave 160 meter loop fed with 450 ohm ladder line, like Tony's dipole is. I then hooked up the MFJ antenna analyzer to it and tried to tune the antenna to 75 meters. The needle just jumped all over the place. I finally got it tune to about 1.3 to 1, but as soon as I would touch the tuner the needle on the analyzer would to crazy.

So, off came the cover to see what I could see. No lose connections, no burned 4 to 1 balun, and no arc over marks on the variable caps. In this tuner the coil is mounted vertical in the case, no lose wires, no wire touching. I did notice that one of the plastic separators for the coil stuck up higher than the others. I checked to see if it was hitting the top of the cabinet, it was. So I cut this off with an x-acto saw and in the process noticed that the cover for the cabinet was painted on the inside. No good contact with the bottom part that the ground is attached to. So I took the Dremel tool and got rid of some paint around the screw holes and also decided to put some washers under the screws just to make things tighter. If you have ever seen a Johnson kilowatt match box tuner you will notice there is like 40 plus screws that hold that top on. Johnson wanted good contact. MFJ uses 8 screws total on a 949E. Anyway, put the screws in, tightened them well, and tried again. It did make a difference.

Then I took a long plastic tuning tool I have and started touching the tuner to see if any specific location on the tuner made more of a difference. Touching the knobs for the inductor switch and knobs for both tuning caps got a big reaction. Took the knobs off and found all three of the nuts holding these in the chassis were lose. Tightened those up, put everything back together and guess what problem solved!! I have used it on the air several times great performance.
