HAM SHACK OR STUDIO B?


Editor Note: Remember last month I wrote about waiting to see more revealing pictures? Well, here they are and what a great set of pictures they are. Dave's Toy Box trains have been the topic of discussion on many occasions on the U. P. Net. Dave has done a beautiful job on his Railroad System and sharing these detailed pictures and his story.

Dave Peck - KD8KCV - Gaylord, MI

I model the Chesapeake & Ohio for Progress in the late 60's & 70's. It is N-Scale, 1/160th scale. I have been collecting trains since I was a teen. I have G-Scale, 027-Scale, HO-Scale, N-Scale, Wood Scale (x2) and Coal Scale (made out of Coal). Yes, it will burn.



When I was a boy in Ludington, I could see both RXR yards and the docks where they loaded the Car Ferries from my upstairs bedroom window. I would watch them for hours. On a hot July night, I climbed out my window, sat on the roof with a nice cool breeze watching the trains switching and loading the SS Spartan when my mom caught me, and I didn't do that again.



I started out with what is called a "Cookie Cutter Layout". I built tables and covered them with 3/8" plywood. From the drawing I marked and cut all the right of way. Then I elevated the right of ways, the easiest way to change elevations during construction. I laid out the track and run wiring under the tables. I stapled strips of cardboard to give gaps rigidity. I used insulation foam to carve out terrain. It then was covered with plaster gauze and wet brushed to smooth it out. Using a very light plaster called Hydrocal. I wet and covered the


plaster gauze with Hydrocal and smooth it to the shape of terrain needed. Hydrocal is a very light plaster, but you have about 5 minutes and it's setting up. Easy to sand or carve. I also casted all the rocks in molds and died them with pigments and then placed them on the layout. Now I painted it all with a soil color latex. Then comes the Streets and Gravel roads. Brushing the terrain with 10% Elmer's glue and water, I apply the ground cover with a shaker. Then mist the ground cover to hold the grass cover in place. Then you plant the bushes and shrubs with lichen and colored ground foam. Plant hundreds of trees.






Then build and detail buildings or kit bash items where needed (kit bashed. No model exists so you kit bash one out of something). The manufacturing building has a stairway on the outside of the building. I built the stairs the same way you would except this one is built with my trusty tweezers and hemostats. Some of the detail painting is done with a very small brush. That's getting harder but my dexterity is still pretty good.





I have two main lines and I can run two trains at once, and can also run a switcher engine in the yards. With one Kato 8 wheel drive F7 locomotive, I can pull 31 RXR cars up the grade. Any more RXR cars and I need a second engine due to wheel slippage. Then, it's a must to throttle back coming down the decent. If not, you will have a runaway. Ending up with the worse case scenario. "Wheels on the ground".

There are 3 tunnels, 4 bridges, 30 switches. 13 Engines and 114 pics of rolling stock and a bunch of model structures. A couple are pre-assembled gifts. I still have a lot of small detailing to do on some structures, and have fun running long trains.





While running the trains, if there is a radio call, I turn my chair to the right, I'm in my shack. Most model building and train maintenance is done at the work bench. And yes, the Coal engine I got in West Virginia will burn. My favorite engine is the H-8 Allegany by Lima works built for the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway. The most powerful steam locomotive ever built, approximately 7,500 hp. Our finest diesel locomotives today produce 5,000 hp. But you don't need a crew for each diesel locomotive where you do with steam. Therefore, the demise of steam.
