<u>VERTICAL ANTENNA INSTALL</u> Kent Babcock – N8RKD – Arcadia, MI

Last year I was complaining to my friend Dave, NS8S, about my lack of DX success. My 132 foot doublet at around 30 feet coupled with living in an RF black hole wasn't able to get too much more than the continental U.S. Dave suggested that the low doublet has a rather poor takeoff angle for distant stations and that perhaps a vertically polarized antenna might be in order. He had a Hy-Gain DX-88 vertical antenna for sale that handles 80 through 10 meter bands and will also do 160 meters with an add-on kit. I searched the couch cushions,

emptied the piggy bank, cashed in all my returnables and headed for Dave's QTH. We loaded up the sections of antenna in my car and had just enough room between the tailgate and windshield for the longer pieces.

I'd already picked out the location for the new antenna, leaving adequate room for the necessary radials.

I found a 6 foot length of pipe in my junk pile Inventory, dug a hole and drove it in with a T-post driver, filled the remaining hole with a couple bags of QuiKrete and let it set up while I kluged a tilt over mount, materials also gleaned from my inventory. After all, why buy something for \$X when I can make it myself for \$2X?? I stole the idea from Dave's vertical mount and here are the results.



The aluminum channel at the right side of the picture was drilled and tapped for 1/4-20 bolts and would function as the radial attachment point. Using two long lag bolts, I measured and cut the required radials



The visible radials were secured on top of the sod with lawn fabric staples and by this spring were completely covered.

Performance results are truthfully inconclusive. Sometimes the dipole still works better. The most fun came from fabricating the tilt mount, and the antenna requires no tuner action on 20 meters.
