

September 13, 2023 Ray, K8RLE, left Dimondale for a POTA trip. First stop was Greenville, MI to pick me up and we were off about 8:30 in the morning and our first stop was Edmore State Game Area where we made our first activations. We left from there to head up to near Evart, Mi to the Buckstop (Ray's camp) for the day.



September 14, 2023 Friday morning we left real early and headed to our first stop at the Otsego State Park, south of Gaylord, about 8:30 in the morning. We met the man at the gate and he let us right in. We set up and made our contacts on 40 meters. Our first contact was with Brad, KR8P. The officer at the park knew about Ham Radio because his uncle was a Ham. We left there and on our way up to Mackinaw City where our first stop was Fort Michilimackinac State Park where we made our contacts and moved on again to Historic Mill Discovery State Park. We made our contacts there and moved up across the Mackinaw Bridge and found our motel for the night and we went to our 4th park that day, Father Marquette National Memorial. We made contacts there and went for dinner.











September 15. 2023 We were up at 5:30 and had our breakfast at 6:00 and headed for the Star Line, Mackinaw ferry to take us to Mackinac Island.

THE BUTTON INVENTION

Everyone knows I like to build little projects. The need in this case was for Larry, W8WR, to be able to operate my RCforbs Remote Hams System. In the past Larry was able to use his mouse to push the TX button on the Client software on his computer screen. Larry is no longer able to do this and we needed a way for him to talk with us. We have important stuff to talk about you know, HI HI. I setup VOX on his Client software but that turned out be a disaster. In this case VOX is very sensitive to voice levels and delays and just was not reliable.

I decided to build this little PTT switch with USB interface to connect to his PC and work with RCforbs Client. I had most of the parts on hand except the box itself. I quickly ordered the right size box I needed to fit this project. You might recognize the button. It is a button found on demonstrator trinkets at the store to push to play a song or turn on a light. I saved these buttons from some of the trinkets I purchased over the years. It seemed like the perfect button for this project because it has a distinct click for feedback when pushed. The box has a momentary PTT switch and an LED indicator that lights when the button is pushed or flashes if the interface driver is not installed properly on the PC or the Client software control device settings are not correct.





Here is Larry, W8WR, with his new-to-him Kenwood TS-2000 HF radio. Ray, K8RLE, and I went to Larry's house to get him all setup with some new equipment. Ray was doing some custom programming on the PC to make it easier for Larry to operate while I installed the VS-3 Voice Systicational in his TS-2000. I made all the necessary connections to antenna, microphone, code key, power supply, ground. Then I changed some programming options and general settings in the TS-2000 to fit Larry's operating needs.

We spent some time training Larry on the operation and location of the buttons on the radio. Larry was a very quick learner. Larry imediately made two CW POTA contacts and I made an SSB contact to test it out. All working good.

We are excited to say Larry is back on the air! He is making POTA contacts (look out Brad, KR8P, he may catch up with you on POTA) and talking on the U. P. Net. and working CW like a monster. You can also see he is demonstrating his new custom made Push-To-Talk button for RCForbs Remote Hams Client. Now he can easily push the button without a mouse to talk with Ray and Monty, N8OBV, and myself on my two meter remote. We use the remote everyday to keep in touch. Ray and Larry like to chase POTA spots and exchange contact information.

We all like to chat and I like to keep their equipment running. It's a never ending task, HI HI, but still fun.



Ray didn't want to be left out, so I built another custom PTT Button for him. Ray operates his Remote Hams Client from Florida during the winter so this will make it very easy for him to lay back in his easy chair in Florida and keep in touch with Larry and myself and others on my 2-meter remote here in Dimondale.



Naturally I had to make a Button for myself too. We call ourselves the Three Buttoneers! I think this is what Amateur Radio is all about. Helping each other and just having fun!
